Hillyer is currently accepting proposals for solo and curated exhibitions that will take place at Hillyer's contemporary art space between January 2027 and December 2027. Proposals are open to local, regional, national, and international artists.

Overview

All proposals that meet Hillyer's criteria and qualifications will be reviewed by Hillyer's **Advisory Committee, which is composed of established artists, curators, and arts professionals, and chaired by Hillyer director, Tim Brown.**

Through a competitive selection process that will take place over a 4–5 week period, 15 to 25 **emerging and **accomplished** artists and curators will be selected.**

Note: The solo artist category is intended for individual artist submissions (not group shows). If you are proposing an exhibition with **two or more artists**, you must apply as a **curator** on behalf of the group.

- **One of Hillyer's three gallery spaces**
- **\$450 stipend**
- **Exhibition opening and reception**
- **Assistance with installations**
- **Assistance with labels and didactics**
- **Marketing and press releases**
- **Public programs**
- **Digital content material and online publicity**
- **Mentoring from one of Hillyer's Advisory Committee members**

Submission Form

**All proposals are submitted
through an online form. The form
is organized into **five** sections:**

- **Profile Information**
- **Proposal**
- **Support Materials**
- **Engagement**
- **Availability**

1. Profile Information

- **Name Address, City, State, Zip
Code, Country**
- **Emerging or Accomplished Artist***

2. Proposals

In the **proposal section, you will include an artist or curator statement, exhibition title, exhibition description, and biography. Each one should not exceed 150 words.**

Artist Statement

The **artist statement should provide a general overview of your artistic practice and describes the concepts or principles that inform your work. See below for information about **curator** submissions.**

Exhibition Description

Exhibition descriptions should describe the specific content pertaining to your exhibition proposal. This helps judges to understand the uniqueness of your project relative to your overall body of work.

Biography

The **biography should provide a clear and concise summary of your life and work, including formal training and key moments in your artistic development.**

3. Support Materials

Support materials include links to a Google Drive shared folder with images and one two-page document. Separate links to videos and online resources can also be included.

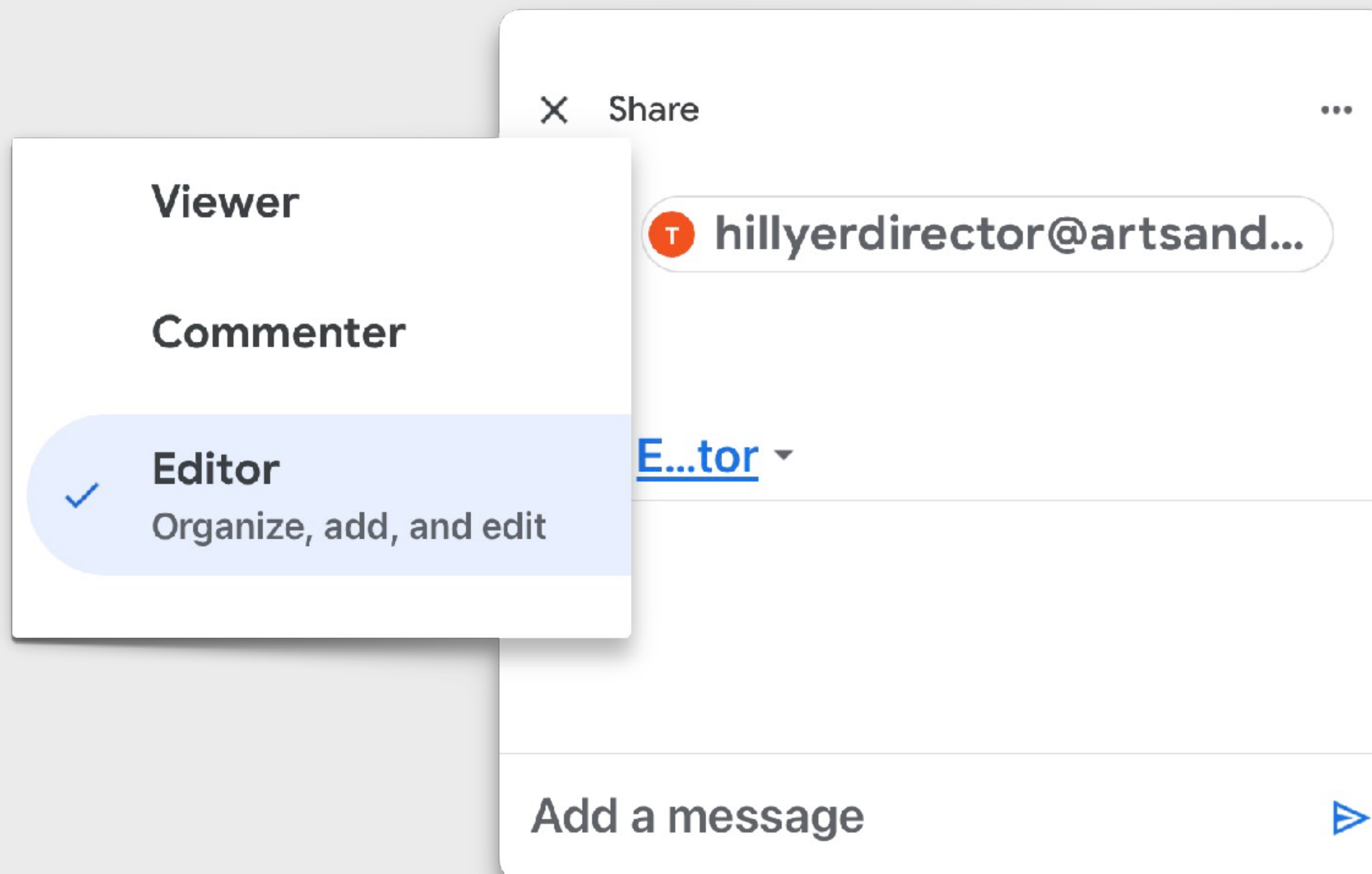

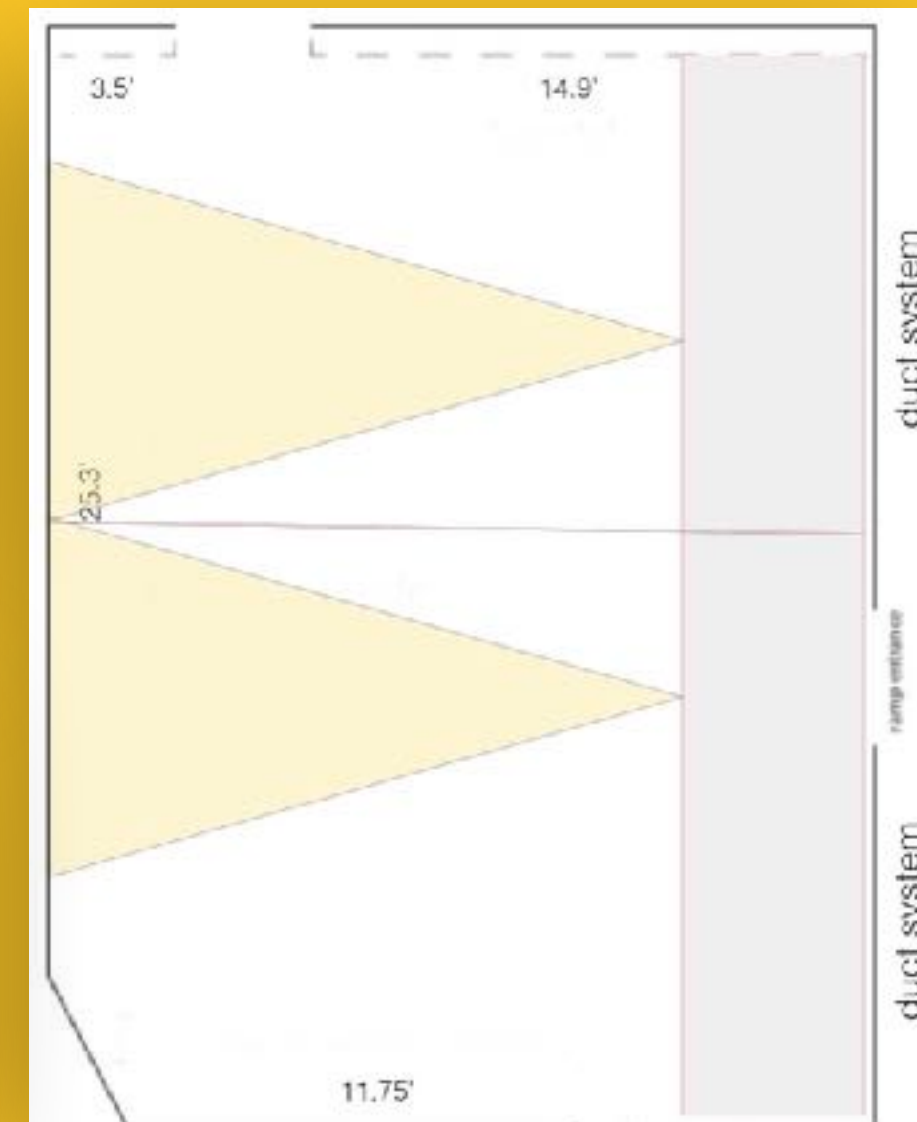

When setting up permissions for **Google Drive**, make sure to select “editor” and not “viewer” or “commenter.”

Submitting Images



Images should represent the individual works of art referenced in the proposal, but may also include installation shots or other relevant material.

Image Guidelines

- Do not exceed **6 images**.
- Each image should not exceed **2 MB**.
- Images must be in jpg format (png or tiff files are not accepted).

Documents

One document can be added to the same shared folder that has been set up for the images. The document can include additional text (not included in the project description) and thumbnail images, floor plans, etc.

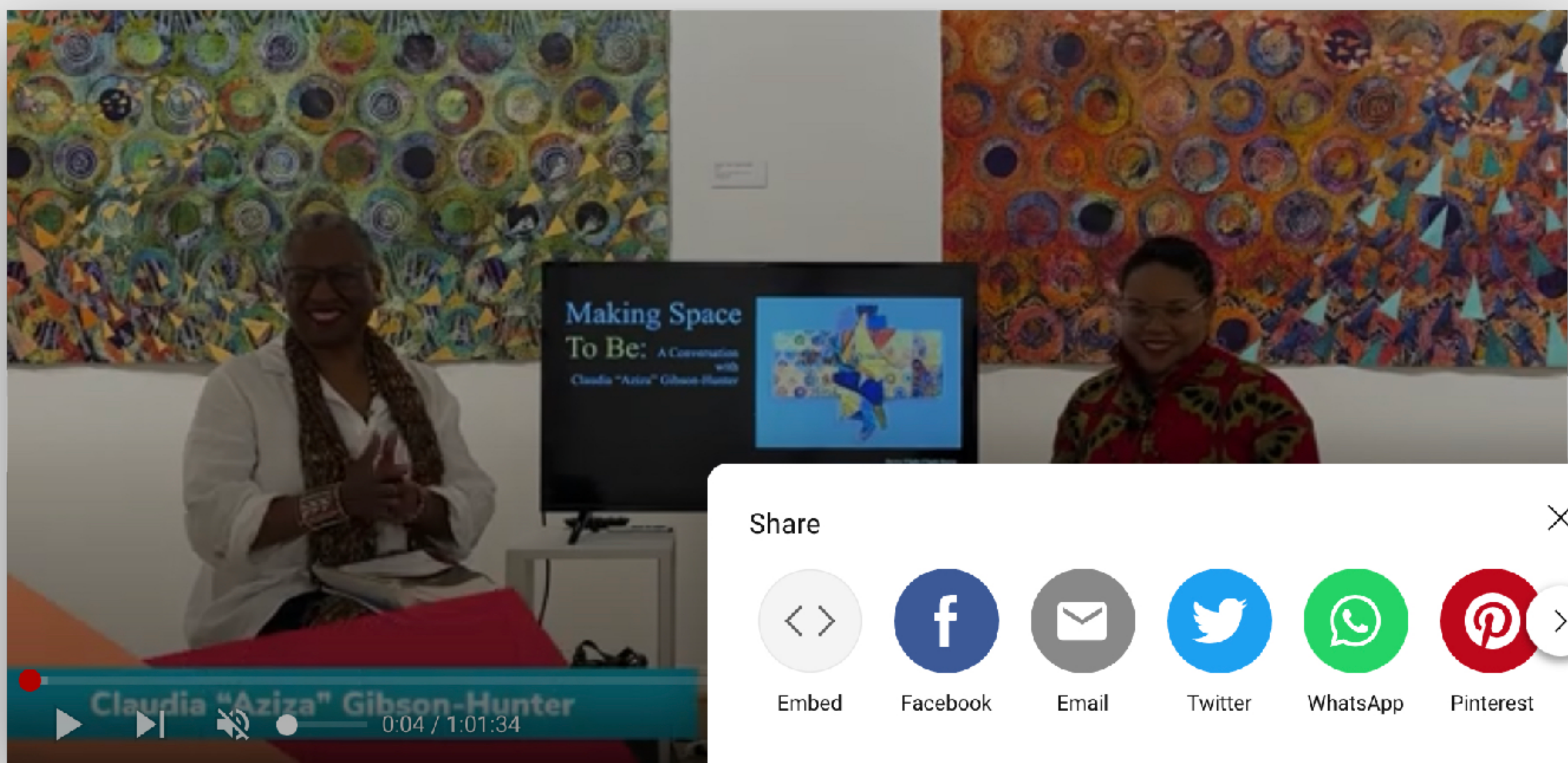

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5. Availability and Options

In the final section of the submission process, artists and curators will be required to agree to the exhibition timeline beginning in January 2027 and ending in December 2027.

Further Explanations

**Emerging and
Accomplished artists
and curators**

An **emerging artist is someone who has not received more than 2 solo exhibitions during their career. An **emerging curator** is someone who has not curated more than two exhibitions.**

An **accomplished artist** is someone who has received 3 or more solo exhibitions during their career. An **accomplished curator** is someone who has curated three or more exhibitions during their career.

Curator

Submissions

Exhibition Proposals should define the basic concept of the proposal and how artists will support the curatorial vision for the exhibition (including shared or divergent perspectives and mediums; social, political, historical environmental; gender, sexuality, autobiographical factors, etc.).

Curatorial statements (in place of artist statements) should provide broader insights into the curator's vision, as a whole, and how the proposal plans to address, expand and/or diverge from earlier precedents or ideas.

Biographies should cover the professional history of the curator and any pivotal moments (e.g. exhibitions, collaborations) that can provide insights into the curator's development.

Final Review

(Main Menu)

After the date has closed for proposals, artist submissions will be reviewed over a four-to-six-week period. The artists selected will be announced in **October. Artists who are not selected will also be contacted at this time.**

Subject matter represents the visual representation and the **content** refers to the conceptual underpinning.

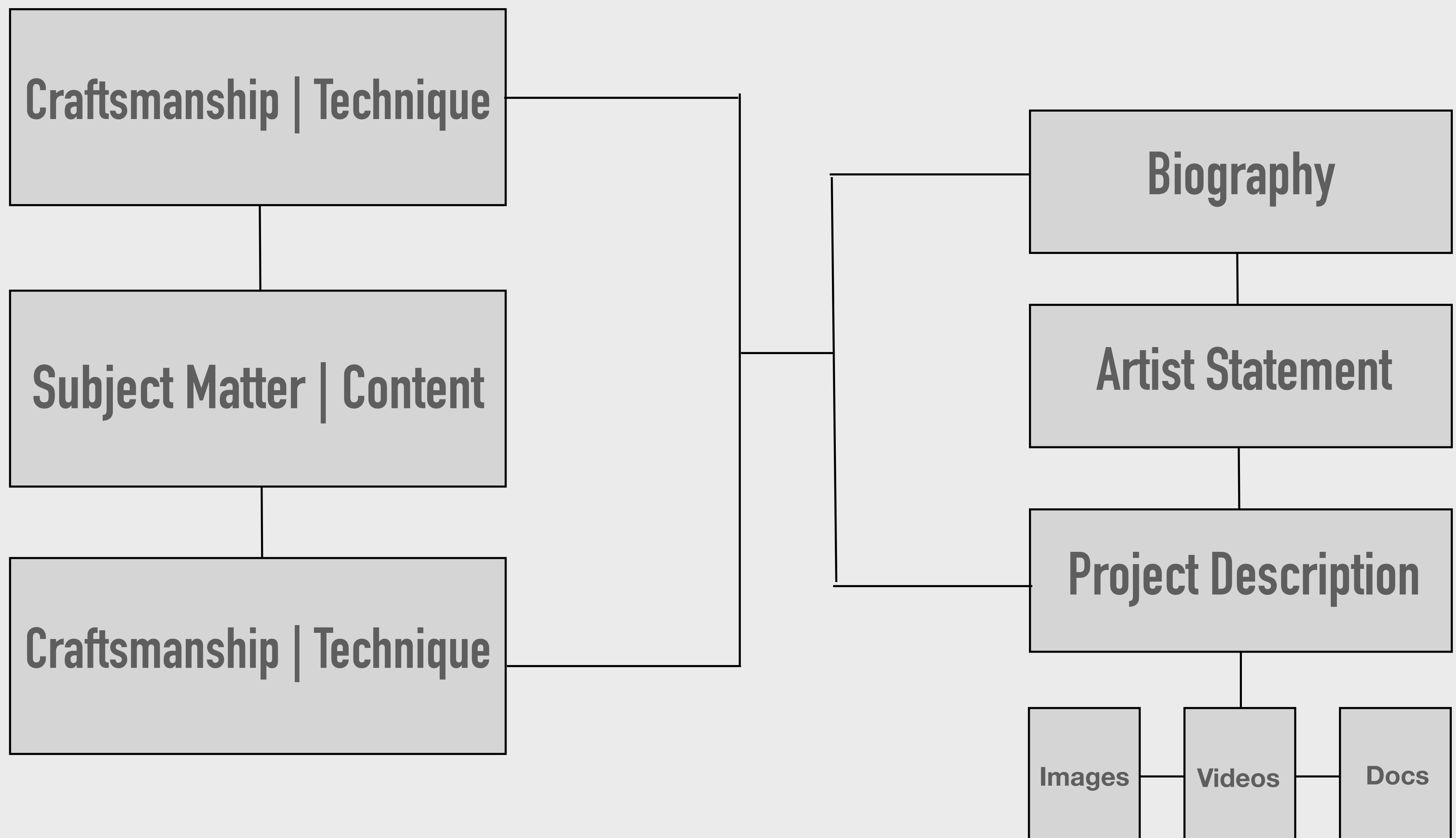
Originality and Innovation

Craftsmanship and Technique

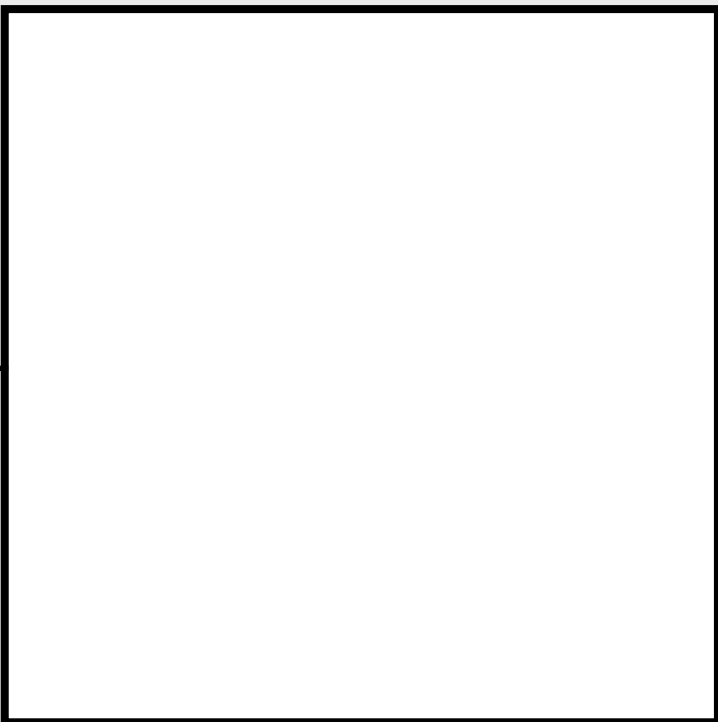
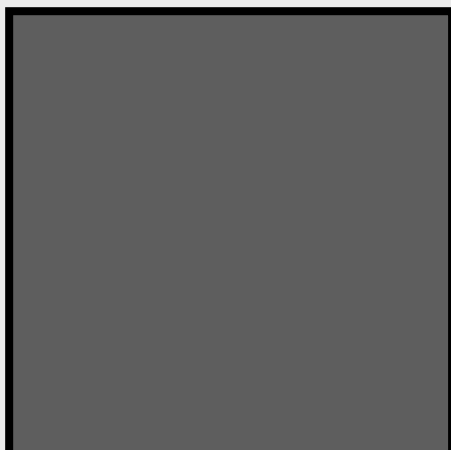
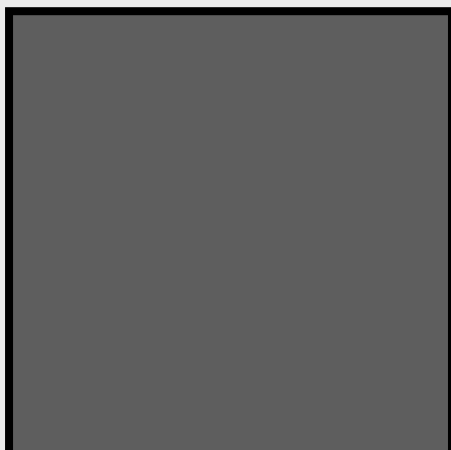
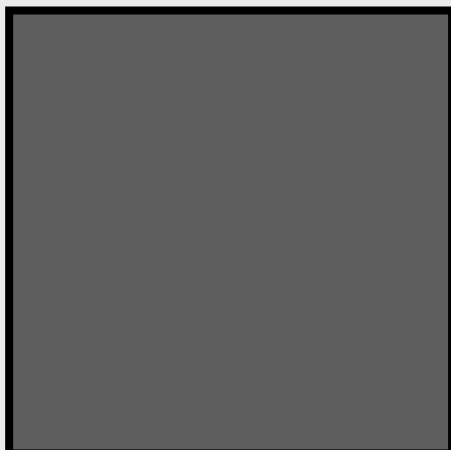
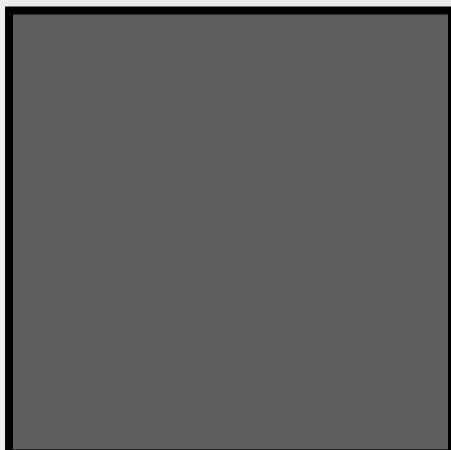
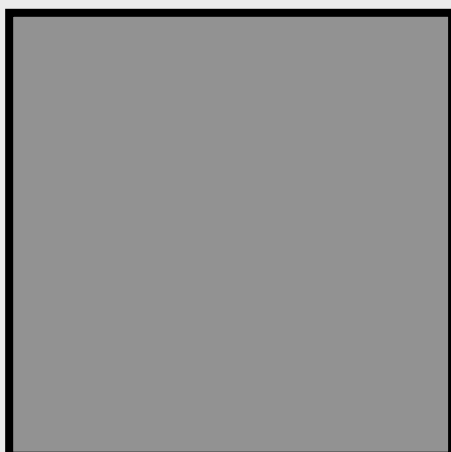
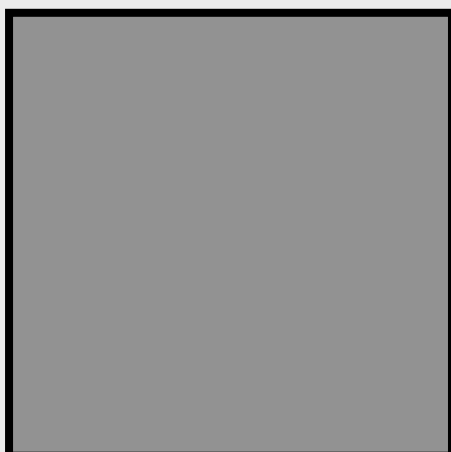
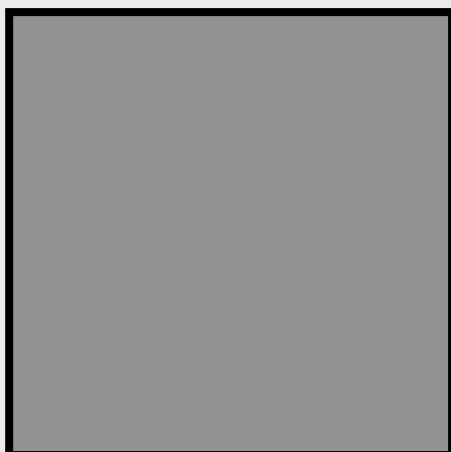
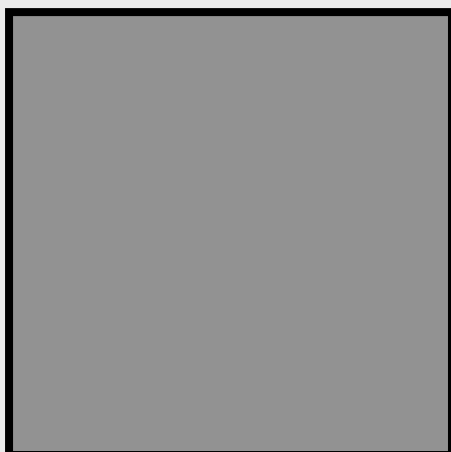
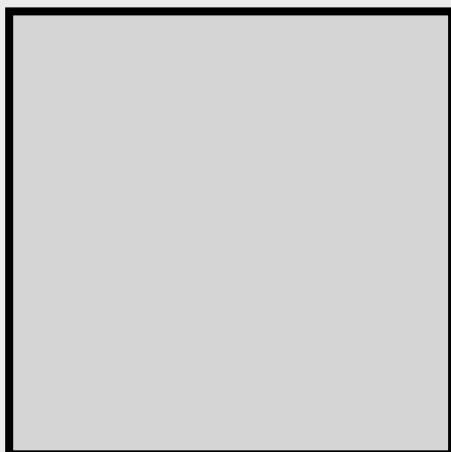
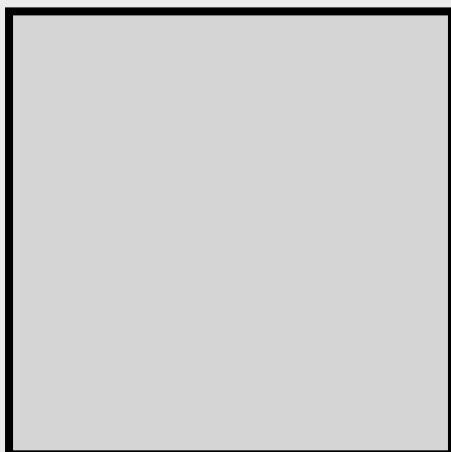
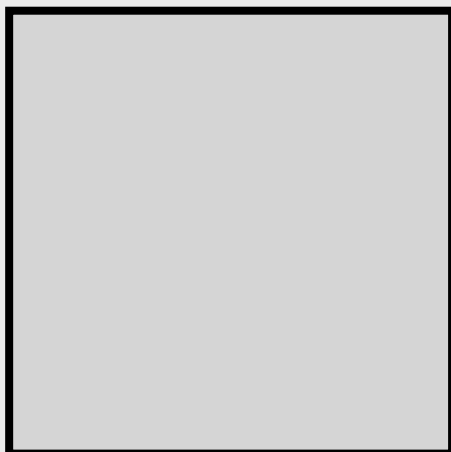
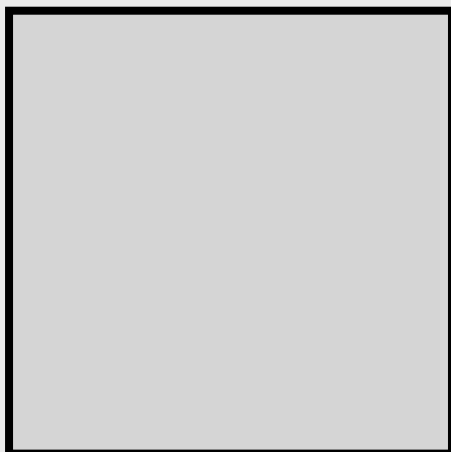
